

OBJECTIVE

WELCOME ACTIVITIES AND INTRODUCTORY COURSE

Iln this programme we organize welcome activities to get to know other students, the city, our campus and the way how we work in Artevelde. After the welcome week, you can choose to be part of an introductory international course (4 weeks on Thursday and Friday) followed by a practical placement. The introductory course is named 'person centered communication in an intercultural context' where you will cooperate with Flemish and South-African students. This course contains live and online lessons

Our programme is organised in the spring semester and starts on 5th of February with a welcome week. Easter holidays starting on 1st April and ending 14th op April. During Easter holidays internships can be planned.

3 ECTS (2 days per week/6 weeks + tasks)

Assessment: paper

CLINICAL PLACEMENT*

What will you learn?

- Practicing your clinical thinking and nursing skills in a real context (hospital ward, home care, community care, residential care).
- Grow in your intercultural and international competences, by experiencing the differences in culture, reflecting on them, comparing professional practice in your home country with professional practice in Belgium/Flanders, ...

Credits and timing: choice or combination of

- 5 ECTS (112,5 h = 3 weeks)
- 7 ECTS (150 h = 4 weeks)
- 9 ECTS(187,5 h = 5 weeks)
- 11 ECTS (225 h = 6 weeks)
- 12 ECTS (262,5 h = 7 weeks)
- 14 ECTS (300 h = 8 weeks)
- 16 ECTS (337,5 h = 9 weeks)
- 18 ECTS (375,5 h = 10 weeks)

Assessment

- Feedback and evaluation in the middle and end of each period. So, for example, students who do 2 internships, will have 2 mid-term and 2 final assessments
- Is done by means of an assessment form with specific criteria and outcomes.
- Done by supervisor from Nursing programme in consultation with student and mentor of the placement.

CLINICAL PLACEMENT*

What will you learn?

Increasing your autonomous clinical thinking, performing risk selection and conducting midwifery skills in a delivery, maternity or neonatology ward.

Credits and timing: choice

- 6 ECTS (150 h = 4 weeks)
- 12 ECTS (300 h = 8 weeks)
- 18 ECTS (450 h = 12 weeks)

Final assessment done by mentor (ward) and supervisor (host institution) in consultation with the student by the Medbook tool.

3 ECTS (2 days per week/6 weeks + tasks)

Assessment: paper

CLINICAL PLACEMENT*

What will you learn?

Experience the challenge of working in a setting that is culturally different to your own and where, due to language barriers, new communication skills are developed. Develop an occupational therapy intervention with a client while becoming part of a multi- disciplinary team. Understand new roles and skills while applying your own individual knowledge and skills in a professional environment that may not be available to you in your home country.

Credits and timing: 15 ECTS (+/- 150 h = 8 weeks)

Assessment: written assignment and ongoing assessment of skills, attitude and knowledge.

INTERNATIONAL MODULE ON PAEDIATRIC REHABILITATOIN (optional during clinical placement)

What will you learn?

- Focus on the different aspects of the early childhood and development, the medical interventions and the rehabilitation of children within the setting of the hospital.
- Focuses on the rehabilitation of children with developmental and acquired brain injuries. (locomotor and neurological pathologies).
- No focus on: learning disabilities, pervasive disorders.

Credits and timing: 3 ECTS (2 weeks from 18 -29 March)

Assessment: oral exam

EASTER BREAK

ADVANCING OCCUPATIONAL JUSTICE THROUGH HEALTHY OCCUPATIONS (optional)

What will you learn?

Using the Participatory Occupational Justice Framework (POJF), you will learn how to analyse community organisations to see if they are enabling, mediating and advocating for occupational justice.

Credits and timing:

3 ECTS (1 week + preparatory work 13-17 May)

Assessment: group presentation

INTERNATIONAL COURSE ON THE USE OF CREATIVITY IN OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY (DWORP)

What will you learn?

Central themes in this intensive programme are the exploration of the 5 different creative thinking skills (delay judgement, observe creatively, develop your imagination, flexible association, diverge) while experiencing several creative media (drama, art, film, photo, movement and dance, sound and music).

Credits and timing

3 ECTS (1 week: 17-24 May)

Assessment: group presentation

*Additional Fee

Approximately 300 euro for food and accommodation at external training centre

3 ECTS (2 days per week/6 weeks + tasks)

Assessment: paper

CLINICAL PLACEMENT*

What will you learn?

The content of the internship depends on the agreement made with the contact of person of the sending Institute (= the Institute of the incoming student). This can be in the field of Clinical Audiology (+ Vestibulometry) and/or Hearing Aid Fitting (+ CI) and/or Preventive Audiology and/or Hearing Rehabilitation, in children and/or in adults.

Credits and timing

6 ECTS (4 weeks: 150 h)

Final assessment

Completed by supervisor (host institution) in consultation with the student

ACROSS BORDERS (optional or clinical placement)

What will you learn?

Literally step across borders and approach audiology from an international perspective in cooperation with audiology students from various international partner institutions.

Push the limits in professional reasoning, by encouraging students to think beyond the most common and obvious.

Push the limits by looking beyond one's own discipline.

Credits and timing

3 ECTS (1 week)

Assessment

Permanent evaluation during intensive programme. Completions of student's tasks. Participation in discussion groups, resulting in a written report.
